THE BOOK OF ALL BOOKS Mark Lindley

We live in a time when skepticism regarding God's existence is increasing. Those who profess atheism are writing books, giving lectures, and teaching in some universities that believing in God is a thing of the past and for the ignorant.

Nevertheless, for those whose minds are open, honest, and objective there is powerful, abundant evidence for God's existence. The God of which I speak is the God of the Bible.

Just one piece of evidence for God's existence is the Bible, itself. Some argue that it is circular reasoning to use the Bible as evidence for what the Bible teaches about the existence of God. However, in the courts of our land, those accused of violating law are allowed to take the stand and speak in their own defense.

By the same principle, the Bible should be admissible as one piece of evidence for the existence of God. The Bible should be allowed to "speak for itself."

The argument for God's existence based upon the Bible might be constructed as follows: 1) If the Bible is a book that cannot be accounted for upon natural grounds, then there must have been a supernatural, guiding power behind the production of the Bible; 2) the Bible cannot be accounted for upon natural grounds; 3) therefore, there must have been a supernatural, guiding power behind the production of the Bible. I affirm that the only being able to produce such a remarkable book is God.

What does the Bible claim for itself? "All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness: That the man of God may be perfect, throughly furnished unto all good works" (II Timothy 3:16-17).

One line of evidence that the Bible is inspired of God is prophecy. Only God knows the end from the beginning (Isaiah 46:9-10). Skeptics choose to ignore literally hundreds of prophecies about the birth, life, mission, death, burial, and resurrection of Christ. Some of these prophecies were made a thousand years before Christ came. It was predicted that Jesus would be born of a virgin, would die for the sins of others, and would be buried in a rich man's tomb (Isaiah 7:14; 53:4-6, 9). It was further prophesied that Jesus would arise from the dead. ascend to heaven, and establish an everlasting kingdom, the church (Psalm 16:8-11; Acts 2:25-31; Daniel 7:13-14; Colossians 1:13, 18). These prophecies are a small sample of the ones made concerning Christ.

Many additional prophecies were made in Old Testament times concerning other people, nations, and events which came to pass. That such prophecies were made is indisputable.

How can one account for hundreds of prophecies fulfilled upon natural grounds? I maintain that one cannot, and that there must have been supernatural intervention—God—to produce the Bible.

The Bible is the Book of all books. Read it. Study and meditate upon it, and your faith will be increased that the Scriptures truly are inspired of God.

I AM IMPORTANT IN BUILDING A STRONGER CHURCH James Pilgrim

Paul wrote, "Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord, and in the power of his might." (Ephesians 6:10). This was an exhortation to each saint at Ephesus (1:1), and to us. However, to the extent each member of the "glorious church" (5:27) is strong, so is the church. A chain is no stronger than the weakest link.

Paul's inspired (1 Corinthians 2) challenge involves putting on "the whole armour of God" (6:11-13), which is described in verses 14-16. Paul wrote, "Stand therefore, having your loins girt about with truth, and having on the breastplate of righteousness; And your feet shod with the preparation of the gospel of peace; Above all, taking the shield of faith, wherewith ye shall be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked. And take the helmet of salvation,

and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God." All of this is supported by personal supplicatory (requests) prayer for self, and "for all saints." (Verse 17). It is no wonder that Jesus said "that men ought always to pray, and not to faint" (Luke 18:1), or that Paul was inspired to write, "Pray without ceasing. In every thing give thanks: for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you." (1 Thessalonians 5:17, 18).

What may "I" do to make the church stronger? The question is not what the elders, deacons, preacher, Bible class teachers, or others should do, but what may "I" do. First, I can "put on the whole armour of God." Many Christians are doing some things.

The seven churches of Asia are examples being partially right. (Revelation 2 and 3). However, God wanted them to be more than that. (Revelation 3:15). Can one be as strong as God wants by adding a few of the Christian graces, or am I to add all of them? (2 Peter 1:5-7). Will I please God by having a few of the fruits of the Spirit? (Galatians 5:22-26). May I love in part, or must I employ each of the characteristics of love. (1 Corinthians 13:4-8). Can I acceptably serve God

by doing a few things? (Philippians 4:8).

The lost on Pentecost asked, "What shall we do?" (Acts 2:37). These hearers were told to "repent, and be baptized." (Verse 38). Could they have been saved by repenting only, or by

being baptized only? NO! Neither can the saved faithfully follow God by doing part of His will, while ignoring the rest. What then must "I" do to be stronger and make the church stronger? I can "grow in grace, and in the knowledge of the Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ." (2 Peter 3:18). Such growth comes as a result of study (2 Timothy 2:15), searching the scriptures

(John 5:39), and sanctifying (Greek, HAGAIZO, "to make holy, i. e. (cer.) purify or consecrate; (mentally) to venerate:--hallow, be holy, sanctify." (Strong's Exhaustive Concordance, p. 876). W. E. Vine's Expository Dictionary of New Testament Words, p. 318, says, "the acknowledgement of the Lordship of Christ, 1 Peter 3:15." The general definition given is to set apart. As I grow (1 Peter 2:2), I should do more, thus making the church stronger. Cf. John 13:17; James 1:25. (Part II will be in next week's Chapman Challenger).
