STEPHEN AND CANCEL CULTURE Mark Lindley

Stephen was a man of tremendous courage who preached God's Word with great boldness. On the occasion of Acts chapter 7. Stephen preached that he saw the heavens opened and Jesus standing at the right hand of God (Acts 7:56). In the audience that day were unbelieving Jews who rejected Christ. When they heard Stephen preach Christ, they were enraged and "stopped their ears, and ran upon him with one accord, and cast him out of the city, and stoned him" (Acts 7:57-58). Notice from this text that the Jews "stopped their ears." They refused to listen to what Stephen preached. Rather than listening, they stoned to death an innocent, godly man.

We live in a time when some refuse to hear any opposing view. Rather than granting others freedom to express opposing views, the culture "cancels" them. "Canceling" often involves some type of punishment against those—mostly conservative—who attempt to express controversial views. One may lose business, be fired, or publicly shamed if one dares to share an opposing viewpoint. Much like the unbelieving Jews "stopped their ears," some "stop their ears today" and cancel all opposing views.

However, the unbelieving Jews who stoned God's faithful preacher, Stephen, did not change the truth about Jesus. They refused to listen, even stopping their ears, but their rejection of Stephen's message did not change the truthfulness of the message.

Likewise, refusing to listen to opposing views today will not change the truth. Refusing to listen to the pro-life position that abortion is taking innocent, human life, does not change the truth about abortion. Silencing the voices of those who oppose homosexuality, does not change the truth that homosexuality is a perversion of God's plan for human sexuality (Leviticus 18:22; I Corinthians 6:9-10). "Canceling" those who affirm that there are only "two" genders, male and female, does not change the truth that being transgender is a distortion of God's original plan (Genesis 1:26-27).

Christians must always speak with love and compassion for others (Ephesians 4:15). However, if ever there was a time when bold, brave, Christian voices were needed, that time is now! "And now, Lord, behold their threatenings: and grant unto thy servants, that with all boldness they may speak thy word" (Acts 4:29).

- That, during your faithful walk with God, your sins are being cleansed by the blood of Jesus (1 John 1:7).

• That the kingdom of God will never be destroyed (Daniel 2:44; Matthew 16:18).

• That Satan will ultimately be punished, since he has already been defeated (Luke 10:18; John 12:31; Revelation 20:10).

• That heaven and your experience there will be greater than anything you can imagine (Romans 8:18; Revelation 21:4).

On the other hand, you should never assume: • That God cannot/will not forgive you (Romans 5:8; Hebrews 8:12).

• That you know exactly what someone is thinking (1 Corinthians 2:11).

• That you know the motive behind an act of someone toward you or someone else (Matthew 7:1; John 7:24).

- That you know everything (Romans 11:33).
- That you will never fall from grace (1 Corinthians 10:12; Galatians 5:4).

• That all your companions and loved ones will be faithful just because of their association with you (Romans 14:12; 2 Corinthians 5:10).

• That you will be saved just because you come from a strong family or attend a faithful church (Philippians 2:12, 13).

That you will win before you even fight the battle, or run the race (1 Kings 20:11; 1 Corinthians 9:24).
That something is right because you have always thought it was (Acts 26:9; 1 Timothy 1:12, 13).
