CALLING ON THE NAME OF THE LORD

The Bible teaches that one must “call on the name of the Lord” to be saved. On the day of Pentecost, the apostle Peter stated, “And it shall come to pass, that whosoever shall call on the name of the Lord shall be saved” (Acts 2:21). Whatever is involved in calling on the name of the Lord is not optional. According to God’s Word, those who call on the name of the Lord “shall be saved.” On the other hand, those who fail to call on the name of the Lord will be lost. Since salvation depends on calling on the name of the Lord, it is imperative that we understand “how” we can meet this condition for salvation.

The Bible clearly explains what it means to “call on the name of the Lord.” After Peter told the people of Acts chapter 2 to “call on the name of the Lord” (verse 21), the people asked the question, “Men and brethren, what shall we do” (verse 37)? Please notice that they asked what to “do” after they had been instructed to “call on the name of the Lord.” This shows that the people were asking what they needed to do in order to call on the name of the Lord. Peter answered their question by exhorting them to “repent and be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ...for the remission of sins” (Acts 2:38). This is Peter’s own explanation of “how” one calls on the name of the Lord for salvation.

Please observe that those who call on the name of the Lord “shall be saved” (Acts 2:21), and those who repent and are baptized in the name of Jesus Christ receive the “remission of sins” (Acts 2:38). One can readily see that “shall be saved” is equal to “remission of sins.” If one has been “saved” it is because that person has received the “remission of sins.” It must also be true that calling on the name of the Lord is equal to repenting and being baptized for the remission of sins. Both result in salvation from sin. It must be the case, then, that in order to call on the name of the Lord we must repent and be baptized. This is the irresistible conclusion that must be drawn based upon evidence from Scripture.

Calling on the name of the Lord is not merely saying a prayer for salvation or asking the Lord for salvation. Rather, it includes all that one must do to obey the Gospel of Christ (Romans 10:13-17).

BIBLE PREACHERS: PETER—NO. 2 James Pilgrim

God told Cornelius, a centurion (one over 100) of the Italian band, a lost man, but “devout... one that feared God with all his house, which gave much alms to the people, and prayed to God always” (Acts 10:1, 2), “just...of good report among all the nation of the Jews” (Acts 10:22), by an angel (Verse 3), “Thy prayers and thine alms are come up for a memorial before God. And now send men to Joppa, and call for one Simon, whose surname is Peter...he shall tell thee what thou oughtest to do. (Acts 10:4-6). Acts 10:48 says, “commanded.” Thus, they were not just told what they ought to do, but were “commanded” to do as told. (Acts 11:14).

Peter, based upon his background, was reluctant at first to go with those from Cornelius. (Acts 10:9-17). As “Peter doubted in himself what this vision...should mean...the men...sent from Cornelius” arrived, asking for Peter. (Verses 17, 18, 7). “While Peter thought on the vision, the Spirit said unto him, Behold three men seek thee. Arise therefore, and get thee down, and go with them, doubting nothing: for I have sent them.” (Verses 19, 20). Peter obeyed, listened to them, lodged them, and went with them the next day. (Verses 21-23).

Cornelius assembled many of his kinsmen and near friends. (Verses 24, 27). Would it not be refreshing to have this happen today???? “As Peter was coming in, Cornelius...fell down at his feet, and worshipped him. But Peter took him up, saying, Stand up; I myself am also a man.” Preachers, Popes, Bishops (Elders), and such like, are not to be worshipped!!! Peter then told those assembled that Jews were not to associate with others, but God had showed him that he should not call any man common or unclean. (Verse 28). Peter was there at God’s word. (Verses 28, 29).

Cornelius explained why and when he had sent for Peter, telling him that God told him to, and that he had done so immediately. He said, Peter had “well done” in coming. (Verses 30-33). We desire and need that kind of obedience and attitude today.

“Peter opened his mouth, and said...preaching” (Acts 10:34, 36, 42), “Of a truth I perceive that God is no respecter of persons: But in every nation he that feareth him, and worketh righteousness, is accepted with him.” (Verses 34, 35; Hebrews 5:8, 9). He widely preached “peace by Jesus Christ: (he is Lord of all)...That word, I say, ye know, which was published throughout Judaea, and began from Galilee, after the baptism which John preached: How God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Ghost and with power (Verses 36-38). Peter said they witnessed all that Jesus did, “whom they slew and hanged on a tree, Him God raised up the third day, and shewed him openly; Not to all the people, but unto witnesses chosen before of God, even to us who did eat and drink with him after he arose from the dead.” (Verses 39-41; 1 Corinthians 15:1-8).

Peter then said God “commanded us to preach unto the people.” (Verse 42a). He was to tell the people that “it is he which was ordained of God to be the judge of quick and dead.” (Verse 42b). Preach to the quick (living) and dead All the prophets said Jesus would come, and He would save His people from their sins. (Acts 10:43; Isaiah 7:14; 53:10, 11; Deuteronomy 18:15).

“While Peter yet spake these words, the Holy Ghost fell on all them which heard the word.” (Verse 44). This proved to the circumcised (Jews) who had come with Peter that Gentiles could be saved. (Verses 44-46). Peter then asked if anyone could forbid Cornelius, relatives and near friends from being baptized, then “he commanded them to be baptized in the name of the Lord”, that is, by His authority. (Verses 47, 48; 1 Peter 3:20, 21; John 14:15; 15:14).

Acts 11:1-18 is the record of Peter’s convincing rehearsal to the Jews of what had happened. Read especially, verses 14-18. This account should settle many doubts and questions. Read the sermon again, and observe the things the inspired Bible preacher, Peter preached.
